Grand High Priest's Message

Companions,

My hope is that when you are reading this message, you are in good health and spirits. The new year is a time, when many of us are placing things in order, a time when we plan for goals for the year. For many of us, we want to spend the New Year better than the previous. It is magic border, when we think that everything is possible, everything is only before us. I want to simply wish all of you a very prosperous new year and that you achieve all that you have set out to do.

For many of our Chapters, January brings in the installation of officers. A couple of simple reminders this year, for the High Priest, King, Scribe and Captain of the Host, be sure to complete your proficiencies and for the dais officers, submit your responses to the questionnaire. Also, it is not required that the chapter be open during the installation but if the chapter is closed, minutes are still required to be taken recording who was installed (refer to Section 134.10). Lastly, many of our installations are open to the public so this is a great opportunity for us to promote our craft. Plan out the event, make it fun and interesting. Let the public know that the Royal Arch and masonry in general is a relevant part of our society, promote our accomplishments and share your goals.

For many who may not be aware, there is an exciting program happening in Chapters in the San Diego area. A delegation of Royal Arch Masons from Mexico will be coming north to the San Diego area to Page 1 of 17

take part in a ritual school of instruction. This event is coordinated through the General Grand Chapter who is working collaboratively with the Grand Chapter of California. My hats off to REC Richard Bullard, Grand Scribe, for taking the lead and facilitating this event. After the SOI, the same delegation will attend one of our festivals to witness California Royal Arch Masons deliver our Chapter degrees. The goal is to maintain a high level of quality with Royal Arch ritual in all jurisdictions, including with our companions in the south.

As I mentioned in one of my previous messages, as I travel California and meet with the local leaders of our Chapters, I shared a book called Turn the Ship Around by David Marquet. I found it to be an interesting approach to leadership where ownership is at every level of an organization. Here is an attempt to illustrate the evolution of leadership behavior through a series of conversations:

Traditional leader-follower pattern:

Captain: "Submerge the ship"

Subordinate: "Submerge the ship, aye"

To push Control down in the organization, Marquet began using the following speech pattern:

Captain: "What do you think we should do?"

Subordinate: "I think we should submerge the ship, sir"

Captain: "Then tell me you intend to do that"

Subordinate: "Captain, I intend to submerge the ship"

Captain: "Very well"

Giving control without an assurance of competence could lead to disaster on a nuclear submarine,

and so, over time,

The pattern evolved to include an assurance of technical Competence, becoming:

Subordinate: "Captain, I intend to submerge the ship."

Captain: "What do you think I'm concerned about?"

Subordinate: "You're probably concerned about whether it's safe to do so"

Captain: "Then convince me it's safe"

Subordinate: "Captain, I intend to submerge the ship. All crew are below decks, the hatches are shut, the ship is rigged for dive, and we've checked the bottom depth."

Captain: "Very Well"

The final evolution of the language added the third pillar – **Clarity of mission**, becoming:

Subordinate: "Captain, I intend to submerge the ship. All crew are below decks, the hatches are shut, the ship is rigged for dive, and we've checked the bottom depth."

Captain: "Is it the right thing to do?"

Subordinate: "Yes sir, our mission requires that we submerge now in order to (classified reason (-:)"

Captain: "Very Well"

I found this to be a fascinating model of leadership which I believe is extremely well-tuned to what we do as we try to improve ourselves in masonry.

As I have always closed with every article I have written this year, for our chapters to be successful and grow, not only the officers of the chapter but also the members must take an active part. If all of us could attend at least 3 Chapter meetings (25%) this year, our chapter will become stronger and grow. Remember that; "without you, they can do little or nothing; with you, they can accomplish great things".


Happy 2549! May this new Capitular year find for you and yours Happiness and Prosperity! We are in the height of

the Installation season and I wanted to point out some of the options that Chapters have for their Installations to hopefully dispel confusion anv between the Constitution and the Manual of Ceremonies. The pertinent **Sections** Chapter of the Grand Constitution referenced here Sections 65, 105 and 134. Basically the options are the Chapter may be open or Installation closed for at Constitutionally authorized location. If the Chapter is not opened then the Bible remains closed with or without iewels placed closed (not touching) on the cover as the Chapter tradition dictates. If the Chapter is opened for a Public Installation, then it shall be refreshment (jewels called off to broken) Before the public is admitted. In this case, the Chapter must be called back to labor and properly closed after the ceremony is completed and the public has departed. It should be noted that the Chapter may be opened or ample form closed in Constitutional meeting location by a properly authorized Grand Officer presiding. This can only be done if the public is to be present only IF the Chapter is opened and/or closed AT REFRESHMENT and the attending Principal Sojourner (Which could be the Installing Marshall) is briefed to open the Bible without any signs and the jewels are placed on the Bible broken as at refreshment. If this procedure cannot executed be correctly in the opinion of the Grand Officer presiding over the opening and/or closing; then the Chapter should be opened or closed in ample form and called off (or back to labor) in private before the public is admitted. Note that this procedure may only be accomplished Chapter's at the Constitutionally specified meeting

place unless **Dispensation** а is obtained beforehand from the GHP to open the Chapter at a different location. This restriction also applies to ample form opening and closings for any reason. The exceptions to this location restriction are when the Chapter is Not opened for Installation and when two (or more) Chapters are Installing at the same time at the Constitutionally approved location of at least one of the Chapters which can legally open at that location without the need for a Dispensation from the sitting GHP. The Chapter(s) Not opening May take advantage of the open Bible for their installations during the time that the host Chapter is open whether public or private. My hope here is to point out some of the options your Chapter has for this annual celebration of Chapter history! If there are any "What if...?" Questions as a result of this piece, ask vour Inspector first and if He can't answer (doubtful), then your DGL can! We are truly blessed with a treasure trove of ritual staff talent in CA and they await your call to improve your Chapter! All the Best!

THE MAGIC FLUTE

Your Editor hopes you were able to catch **METROPOLITAN** the Opera Radio broadcast on Dec 29th of Mozart's charming operatic fable. This production was the Met's abridged English-language version of Mozart's Die Zauberflote, or The Magic Flute: "a sublime fairy tale that moves freely between earthy comedy and noble mysticism. ... Mozart and his librettist, Emanuael Schikander, were both Freemasons - the fraternal order whose membership is held together by shared moral and metaphysical ideals - and Masonic imagery is used throughout the work." At one point, mid-way through the performance, I heard: "Unless you join the Brotherhood, you will never find the love you seek."

Forms and Documents you will need are located at the Grand York Rite website, which is: www.yorkriteofcalifornia.org.

Scroll down and click on "York Rite Forms and Documents"

Then click on Grand Chapter logo.

A window opens where you enter the userid, which is "cagyr" and the password, which is "brio"

Scroll down to Officers Manual, which has info for the Secretary, and print that out. Priorities are as follows:

- 1. Membership control -- Especially important is the very last item, "Royal Arch Monthly Report." If you fill this out each month, whenever you encounter changes to the membership, you will find it much easier at the end of the year to produce the year-end report, which is used to compute the amount of per capita the Chapter needs to pay. That payment is due by Jan 15th each year. Important changes to your membership include new members, demits, remits and deaths. Maintain e-mail addresses for members and you can easily then forward the monthly newsletter, The WORKMAN, to them.
- 2. Per Capita -- The Per Capita payment, due each Jan 15th, does not require action by the Chapter to be paid. You will need good, up-to-date membership data in order to compute the end-of-year number of active members that is crucial to computing your per capita payment. Without good data you will most likely overpay your per capita requirement. It is sensible to wait until the first of the new year to begin your process. It is also sensible, if you have access to the Grand Lodge database, to check each member to see if they are still alive
- 3. <u>Insurance</u> -- The Insurance payment, due each July 15th, does not require action by the Chapter to be paid. You will be billed for the payment by the Grand Secretary.
- 4. <u>Lodge Book of Marks</u> Maintain this up-to-date, or perhaps arrange for a PHP to take on the responsibility of maintaining.
- 5. Minutes Take good minutes, but don't over-do it by trying to capture everything that is said. Focus on having a clear representation of motions made and the vote count by which they passed or failed. In addition to keeping petitions in a separate file, it is good practice to replicate the basic petitioner information in the minutes. It is also a good practice to keep the names of attendees at each meeting in the minutes. If conferring a degree, keep a copy of the cast members and the candidate(s).

- 6. <u>Grand Chapter</u> Before the May meeting, remind the Dais officers they are responsible to attend, and arrange a stipend if your Chapter can afford it. Remind members who expect to attend to be sure to take their dues cards. If Dais Officers cannot attend, they may issue a proxy, or the Chapter may elect a representative. The appropriate forms can be obtained on the Grand York Rite website: Scroll to "Elected Representative and Proxy Credentials."
- 7. Order of High Priesthood Be sure the current HP and PHPs know they are eligible to receive this Order. In fact, it is a Constitutional requirement! Share the petition below with them and send to the Grand Secretary:







THE HOLY ROYAL ARCH KEYSTONE OF THE SPIRITUAL JOURNEY WITHIN

Abstract from a paper By Robert G. Davis, Education Committee

There is an image in Masonry that is as powerful in its symbolic meaning as any encountered in the whole of the Masonic journey. It is the image of two pillars supporting an arch centered by a keystone, behind which is situated a sacred vault. Enclosed within this vault is the Ark of the Covenant. And within this set of symbols is found the great secret of the Royal Arch, and the central thought of Masonry.

And then there is the question of the "incomplete" nature of the Master Mason degree, lending credence to an argument that it was never intended to be the last of the Craft degrees. Certainly, it seems unlikely that a Masonic degree which provides a legend in which something is lost (and another substituted in its place until it can later be found) would represent the pinnacle, or end, of a progressive system of degrees.

When the Grand Lodge of the Ancients established its Constitution in 1751, it made the Royal Arch an essential degree to the Craft system of degrees, thus launching what would eventually become the "ne plus ultra" of Capitular Masonry across the globe. In this degree, we find three candidates in waiting to be "exalted to the august degree of Royal Arch." The ceremony of exaltation transfers them from the region of symbolic Masonry, wherein lessons in morals and ethics are taught by allegory; into the domain of religion, wherein the nature of God in man is revealed through the discovery of the WORD. ... (Thus) by being joined together, they symbolically ceased to be separate individuals - they now represent the "Complete Man," comprised of Body, Soul, and Spirit. From this point forward, the three candidates are motivated by a single desire - to be "exalted" to the spiritual plane of being ...

In the final section of the degree, the candidate is presented with a remarkable allegory, the same which can be found in the Master Mason Degree, and the same which exists in all of the ancient mysteries - the great lesson represented by the resurrection of the body and the immortality of the soul. Symbolically, all of these allegorical forms are commenced in sorrow and terminated in joy. The building of the sacred temple out of the ruins of the first represents the rebirth of the human race in a new dispensation to be later revealed – and our own rebirth into a higher consciousness with God. ...

Such is the task of the Royal Arch Mason – to build the spiritual temple of his second life upon the shattered ruins of the old. ... As Royal Arch Masons, we are to be constantly engaged in the noble labor of consciously rebuilding ourselves from the shattered temples of our own passions, intolerance and ignorance; discovering beneath the rubbish the lost treasure of Light and Truth.
