

 2020 Election Procedures
- 1. **Dues Collection:** You should send out dues' notices no later than **October**, with payments from members due by December 31st. MMS Database is used by Grand Recorder for per-capita billing to each Council of Cryptic Masons, with data updated by December 31.
- 2. **Membership control:** MMS Database is used to compute amount of per capita Council needs to pay. Billing is accomplished by Grand Recorder & payment is due by Jan 15th each year. Important changes to your membership include new members, demits, remits & deaths. Maintain e-mail addresses for members & you can easily then forward monthly newsletter, **Workman (Royal Arch Masons) & Sword & Trowel (Cryptic Masons) to them**.
- 3. Do not cavalierly **suspend members** for non-payment of dues. There is a Constitutional process that should be followed rigorously in order that members, who may have moved & not received your dues notice, are treated fairly. See following sections of relevant Constitution in order to learn about this process:

Section 30-10. SUSPENSION FOR NON-PAYMENT OF DUES.

- 1. Any member whose dues & assessments are unpaid for a period of 12 months may be considered for suspension.
- 2. Prior to such suspension, Recorder, at first Stated Assembly following first day of August of each year, shall furnish to Illustrious Master a list of members who have not paid current dues & assessments. Such members, if possible, shall be personally contacted with reference thereto by Illustrious Master, Deputy Master, Principal Conductor of Work or member appointed for this purpose, who shall report thereupon at next Stated Assembly.
- 3. Members who have not paid current year's dues & assessments by last day of October, & for whom remission of dues has not been recommended by Illustrious Master, shall be notified by Recorder under seal of Council by first class mail to his last known address that either his dues for current year be paid or cause shown for such failure or he may be subjected to suspension by Council at last Stated Assembly of year. Council may, by vote, suspend such members effective 31st day of December, provided their dues have not been received & no action has been taken to remit dues for that cause.
- 4. **Per Capita:** Per-capita is billed to each Council by Grand Recorder. Per Capita payment, due each Jan 15th, does not require action by Council to be paid.
- 5. **Insurance:** You will be billed for Insurance payment by Grand Secretary-Recorder. Insurance payment, due each July 15th, does not require action by Chapter, Council or Commandery to be paid.
- 6. **Minutes:** Take good minutes, but don't over-do it by trying to capture everything that is said. Focus on having a clear representation of motions made & vote count by which they passed or failed. In addition to keeping petitions in a separate file, it is good practice to replicate basic petitioner information in minutes. It is also a good practice to keep names of attendees at each meeting in minutes. If conferring a degree, keep a copy of cast members & candidate(s).
- 7. **Grand Sessions:** Before April meeting, remind Dais officers they are responsible to attend, & arrange a stipend if your Chapter, Council or Commandery can afford it. Remind members who expect to attend to be sure to take their dues cards. If Dais Officers cannot attend, they may issue a proxy, or they may elect a representative. This is true also for Commanderies, whose members cannot issue proxies. Appropriate forms can be obtained on Grand York Rite website: Scroll to "Elected Representative & Proxy Credentials."
- 8. **Grand Council of Thrice Illustrious Masters of California:** Be sure current Illustrious Master & Illustrious Past Masters' know they are eligible to receive this Order. Share petition with them & send to Grand Recorder. Petitions for all three bodies are available at website.

No York Rite in England

There is No York Rite in England

The first Grand Lodge in the world was proclaimed as the 'revival' of Freemasonry. This occurred at an Assembly of Free and Accepted Masons that constituted the 'Grand Lodge of London and Westminster' at the Goose and Gridiron Ale house in London on the 24 June 1717. Now known as the United Grand Lodge of England.

There is no York Rite in England as in California that is composed of the Mark, Past Master (Virtual), Most Excellent Master and Royal Arch.

The Mark degree is under the auspices of the Grand Lodge of Mark Master Masons of England, Wales and its' Districts and Lodge Overseas. The Grand Master, since 1982, is HRH Prince Michael of Kent. (He is the younger brother of HRH The Duke of Kent, Grand Master of the U.G.L.E., and cousin to HM Queen Elisabeth II).

The Grand Lodge of Mark Master Masons has a larger membership than that of the Grand Lodge of California.

There are about 19 separate Grand Lodges of Mark Master Masons worldwide.

There is no Past Master (Virtual) Degree in England only an actual 'Past Master' degree. This Past Master degree, the name of 'Past' is a misnomer and often referred to as a 'Chair' Degree. It is conferred, in a tiled meeting, upon the Presiding Officer elect, by Installed Past Presiding Officers of that organization.

The Most Excellent Master Degree is much shorter and is part of the Royal and Select (Cryptic) degrees.

The Royal Arch Degree is conferred in a Chapter under the auspices of the Supreme Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons. In addition to the Royal Arch Degree, that takes about one hour fifteen minutes to confer, there are three 'Chair' Degrees for the three Principal Officers. The First Grand Principal of the Supreme Chapter is HRH the Duke of Kent. He is also Grand Master of the United Grand Lodge of England and was installed in 1967. Both Grand Lodge and Grand Chapter are separate and autonomous.

I received my Craft, Concordant and Scottish Rite degrees in England and served as one of nine appointed Stewards in my Lodge. A Steward in England works, as referred to in the California Installation ritual, "In olden times, your province was to superintend and provide for the Festivals of the Craft, to assist in the collection of dues and subscriptions, to keep an account of the expenses for refreshments, and to see that the tables were properly supplied and every Brother suitably provided for and to assist in service to the members. Dress was a business suit and white gloves worn in the Lodge".

In olden times....' our duty as Stewards was to 'man' the Bar after the Stated meeting closed and before dinner. We would then wait as wine stewards during the Festive Board. All meals were catered and served by waiting staff.

Eight years later, I progressed to serve as Tyler of the Lodge. By which time I was able to recite the ritual of all three degrees. However, during Schools of Instruction practices we were never allowed to sit in the Master's Chair. A stool was placed in front. In England only a Master or Past Master can sit in the East and confer degrees. At that time, it would have taken another 6 years to become Master of the Lodge.

Unlike California there is no uniform ritual enforced upon the various Masonic organizations. In the U.G.L.E. there are 19 different rituals available with 9 in common usage. The Royal Arch, Mark Master Masons. Cryptic Council and Knights Templar have slight variations in the ritual. Stated Meetings can be just two a year but the norm is six a year with the summer months omitted.

My Lodge had nine meetings a year. My son's Lodge had five. My father's Lodge had eight. Special Meetings very rarely take place and then only after a Dispensation. There is one annual Ladies Night in the Craft. It is a splendid event held at a Hotel with gifts for the ladies. Cost is in the range of \$100 per person.

The Lodge and Concordant Bodies are responsible to ensure the ritual is taught and presented correctly. They also decide who is competent to assume Offices in the Lodge or Concordant Body. Grand Lodge or the respective Concordant Body do not interfere or dictate to the Lodge, Chapter, Council or Preceptory on how to run internal management unless called upon through gross negligence or incompetence. The Director of Ceremonies in the Lodge or Concordant Body (Officer's Coach) is the disciplinarian and controls all ritual and ceremonies. There are no Festivals. I received all my degrees as a single candidate.

When a Lodge reaches a membership near one hundred it is encouraged to form another Lodge. Most Lodges have about forty members, Chapters about thirty, Councils and Preceptories (Commandery) have about 20 members.

Generally, all Masonic meetings begin at 6 p.m. and are followed by a Festive Board with the last Toast soon after 9 p.m. Degrees are shorter as there are no lectures similar to those used in

California. Both the Royal Arch and Mark Degrees take just over one hour, that includes a business meeting, and are conferred at the Stated Meeting. All business is conducted prior to the Stated Meeting by a committee.

The Council Degrees are Most Excellent Master, Royal Master, Select Master and Super Excellent Master.

As with all the other degrees the Knight Templar Orders are much shorter and followed by a Festive Board.

The Council head is the Grand Council of the Order of Royal and Select Masters of England, Wales and its' Districts and Lodges Overseas.

The Great Priory of the United Religious Military and Masonic Order of the Temple and of St. John of Jerusalem, Palestine, Rhodes and Malta of England, Wales and its provinces Overseas is presided over by the Most Eminent Grand Master. The Commandery/Preceptory is very exclusive and composed of three Orders. I had only been a Mason for 6 years when to my surprise I was invited. I found I was among some of the most distinguished Masons in the area. We met three times a year and it would have taken me 15 years to preside as Preceptor/ Commander.

In all the degrees and orders, you are expected to buy your own regalia. After serving as the presiding officer of the Lodge, or any of the Concordant Bodies you buy your own past presiding officer regalia. If you continue to serve in some capacity for two or more years, you may be invited (based upon merit) to receive a Provincial or District Grand rank, for which you pay a fee and again, buy your own regalia. If you continue to serve in an active capacity over a period of years then you may be offered Grand Rank and you pay a fee and buy your own regalia!

There are various levels of Provincial and Grand rank and the higher the rank offered is a reflection of merit for the service you have given. This system serves as an incentive for those who have passed through the Chair to continue to serve their Lodge or Concordant Body.

At the Stated Meeting there is usually a collection for the Almoners Fund. The Festive Board costs around \$40 and there is a raffle for charity and you are expected to spend at least \$10. At most meetings there are a number of visitors who are invited by members. The member pays for the meal for the guest and very often there is a reciprocal arrangement when you are invited to your guest's meeting.

Charity raised from members is a significant part of all meetings.

If you plan to visit one of the Masonic entities under the English constitution then you will need to purchase regalia as it is not provided to visitors. If you are a Past Presiding Officers the regalia costs more.

The fees to receive the degrees and Orders are higher than those charged in California, being related to annual dues.

Based upon 12 years as an English Freemason and 31 years as a California Freemason I believe one of the main differences between Freemasonry in California and England is: California is very intrusive upon the autonomy of the constituent Lodge, Chapter, Council and Commandery/Preceptory.

In England, the Lodge, Chapter, Council and Commandery/Preceptory decide who is best qualified to serve as the presiding Officer and manage its own internal finances without intrusion from the Grand organization. This difference is like being a tenant or being the owner. This subtle difference is reflected in the attitude by which members assume responsibility to create a Lodge, Chapter, Council or Commandery/Preceptory of which they are proud to entertain visitors – even from the Grand Body!

California is much more open and democratic in the way Grand Officers conduct themselves among members. Both Jurisdictions contribute towards various charitable causes.

There is NOTHING in England that equals the Masonic Homes in California.

Guidelines

Guidelines for a VIRTUAL 3/4-Way Reception: How to do it well!

- Host must arrange, develop the Virtual invitation and distribute to all guests.
- Expected dress: Appropriate Jackets, Term ties, lapel pins, Collar and Jewel.
 Communicate this in the invitation!
- Prepare the agenda and distribute with the invitation electronically at least 1
 week prior to the Actual Meeting date.
- Meeting Host check waiting room for virtual admission and verification of guests. Plan at least 30 minutes prior to the beginning of the Reception.
- Master of Ceremonies Welcome and statement of purpose for the reception.
- Honorary Chaplain INVOCATION No altar or Bible is required for the reception!
- Designated Officer PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE OR National Anthem (Ensure that you have a picture of the flag of our country with 50 stars that can be displayed onscreen!)
- Master of Ceremonies or his Designated Officer introduces non-Grand York Rite Officers in attendance, e.g. special guests, Eastern Star, Scottish Rite, Shrine, White Shrine, Youth Group leaders, etc.
- Master of Ceremonies introduce first Grand York Rite Head of Body to all OR (preferred) the Grand Officer in charge of introductions for that Grand Body (note that this is a <u>Requirement</u> for introductions of the Grand Master of Masons)! Order of speaking should be either Royal Arch, Council, Commandery and Grand Master OR Council, Commandery, Royal Arch and Grand Master as desired by the Master of Ceremonies. Please inform the Grand Heads of Bodies which order they will be speaking Before the Reception begins!
- Grand Head of Body Speaking should ask one of his Grand Officers (usually
 one of the Grand Marshals in attendance) if not already recognized by the
 Master of Ceremonies to do the introduction of the Grand Head of Body
 Speaking After introducing the Current and Past Grand Officers present along
 with the DGLs and Inspectors (ritual staff as appropriate) in attendance either
 Before his remarks (preferred) or After his remarks (also OK). Don't forget to do
 these introductions!! Grand Head of Body Speaking then proceeds to deliver
 his remarks in full.
- Master of Ceremonies After thanking the speaker, he can ask for questions for that Grand Head of Body and/or Introduces the presiding officer of each sponsoring constituent body present (including Blue Lodge Masters when it is

the GM turn) and calls upon each one in turn with the host constituent bodies last in each group to make whatever virtual presentation (arranged IN ADVANCE) they have for the Grand Head of Body Speaking. Don't forget to include the Grand Master in these presentations! This would include charitable donations to the charities of that Body if appropriate AND gifts for the lady of the Grand Head of Body Speaking if desired.

- Grand Head of Body Speaking makes his presentations (virtually) back to each
 presiding officer and his spouse (if present or otherwise desired) or the senior
 officer present from that constituent body and his lady (if present). Once all
 exchanges have been made virtually, he announces that his part is complete.
- Master of Ceremonies Introduces the next Head of Body Speaking or the Grand Officer in charge of introductions for that body (<u>preferred</u>). Repeat the procedure above for each Grand York Rite Body present. If there is a musical interlude, the Master of Ceremonies will introduce the interlude per the announced agenda and ask for appreciation of the performers. If the Grand Master of Masons is speaking (not just in attendance as a guest), then ensure that all thanks and acknowledgements for putting on the event are done <u>Before</u> the Grand Master is introduced!
- Master of Ceremonies wraps up with thanks for the folks that made the reception possible, don't forget the Host of the virtual meeting IF the Grand Master of Masons is Not speaking (otherwise done before the introduction of the Grand Master of Masons). Finally, introduce the Chaplain for the Benediction. Adjourn!

Notes:

- Dress Code: The invitation will set the appropriate dress code for the event. The Master of Ceremonies should be dressed for Blue Lodge unless he is presenting as the presiding officer of one of the constituent bodies in attendance. All presenting officers should be dressed as the Grand Head of Body they are supporting prescribes. Changing coats and ties for each segment of the program is acceptable if desired, but not necessary unless presenting on behalf of that body. The Grand Officers and presenting Officers should be dressed as prescribed by the Grand Head of Body they are representing; coat, tie and jewel to match the Grand Head of Body's desires. All other officers and members will wear the respective coat and tie of the constituent body they wish to represent. It is desirable to change coat, tie and uniform if presenting for more than one constituent body.
- Setup of Lodge Room if utilized for pictorial ceremonial purposes will be with Constituent Body Banners (Chapter, Council, Commandery, Blue Lodge, as desired, AMD, etc.). Altar will be draped with an altar cloth with a Closed Bible surmounting, (if desired for viewing).
