Grand High Priest's Message

Companions,

I am humbled beyond words for the honor you have bestowed upon me by electing me as your 165th Grand High Priest. I will do the very best I can to serve each of you and our Grand Chapter. Growth and financial stability in our organization are important to our future and I will put whatever effort I can to improve both of those important keystones of our future.

I like to think that I have good training and preparation to do this job. I have served my Lodge five times as Master (1976, '79, 2001, '03 and '04). Worthy Patron for Eastern Star five times also. Royal Patron for Amaranth twice. Toparch of my Sciots Pyramid. President of my Chapter of National Sojourners and Commander of my Camp of Heroes of '76. President of the Inland Masters and Past Masters Association. District Inspector twice and currently Inspector at large for Grand Lodge. I have served as an Inspector and DGL for Grand Chapter, Inspector, Assistant Director of Ritual and currently as Adjutant with Grand Commandery. High Priest of Stockton Chapter in 2004, Illustrious Master in 2005 and 2008 and Commander of Stockton Commandery in 2006. In addition, I have held Dais offices for several years in the Sonora Bodies.

I believe in being as active as I can to grow myself and the Craft. But I still try to take time to support my wife who is currently the Grand Royal Matron of Amaranth in

California. That makes my household very active and at times confusing. But I pledge to give 100% of the time I have to your service.

I don't have a catch phrase to get your attention at events like many Past Grand High Priests. However, I can promise to do my best and will expect the best from each of you. Building our chapters isn't something I can do. That part of the equation rests solely on your shoulders. We have often heard that if each companion were to bring in just one more member, we could double in membership in one year. I don't expect that. Instead I would like each of our *active* companions to bring in one member. Then, if half of those remain active, we will have made a large step toward saving our Chapters from closing. If this became the annual trend, we could not only grow but thrive. This is your job!

So how do you get members? Since we can only get our members from our Blue Lodges we need to increase their membership and whenever possible assist them in performing the degrees and just as importantly coaching those candidates. This grows a close connection with the candidate and allows you to gently inform him about further light after the third degree. I ask master masons if they would like "to see the rest of the story". We also have an advantage over Blue Lodge in that we can ask masons to join us openly. We have not been out front with a petition as soon as a mason is raised to the third degree like our brothers in Scottish Rite. As a result they have held a larger membership. I like the Scottish Rite and enjoy my membership in that Rite but I want some of those new masons to see our lessons as well. And whenever possible I encourage our Scottish Rite Brothers to join our ranks as well. So I urge you to get them young, "offer the rest of the story" to them, engage them in conversation and bring them to our table also.


Companions,

SECRETARY and/or RECORDER ESSENTIALS

Forms and Documents you will need are located at the Grand York Rite website, which is: www.yorkriteofcalifornia.org.

Scroll down and click on "York Rite Forms and Documents." Then click on the appropriate logo. A window opens where you enter the userid, which is "cagyr" and the password, which is "brio"

Scroll down to Officers Manual, which has information for the Secretary, and print that out. Many concepts in the Grand Chapter manual are relevant to the Councils and Commanderies.

Priorities are as follows:

1. **Dues Collection** – You should send out dues notices no later than October, with payments from members due by December 31st.
2. **Membership control** -- Especially important is the very last item, "Royal Arch Monthly Report." This is relevant to you as a Secretary/Recorder if you do not yet have a userid for access to MMS – Masonic Membership Solutions. If you fill the paper report out each month, whenever you encounter changes to the membership, you will find it much easier at the end of the year to produce the year-end report, which is used to compute the amount of per capita the Chapter needs to pay. That payment is due by Jan 15th each year. Important changes to your membership include new members, demits, remits and deaths. Maintain e-mail addresses for members and you can easily then forward the monthly newsletter, The WORKMAN, to them.
3. Do not cavalierly suspend members for non-payment of dues. There is a Constitutional process that should be followed rigorously in order that members, who may have moved and not received your dues notice, are treated fairly. See the following sections of the relevant Constitution in order to learn about this process:




4. **Per Capita** -- The Per Capita payment, due each Jan 15th, does not require action by the Chapter to be paid. You will need good, up-to-date membership data in order to compute the end-of-year number of active members that is crucial to computing your per capita payment. Without

good data you will most likely overpay your per capita requirement. It is sensible to begin your process near the end of the CY, as soon as possible. It is also sensible, if you have access to the Grand Lodge database, to check each member to see if they are still alive. But most important is getting a userid to utilize MMS.

5. **Insurance** -- The Insurance payment, due each July 15th, does not require action by the Chapter, Council or Commandery to be paid. You will be billed for the payment by the Grand Secretary-Recorder.
6. **Lodge Book of Marks** – Maintain this up-to-date, or perhaps arrange for a PHP to take on the responsibility of maintaining.
7. **Minutes** – Take good minutes, but don't over-do it by trying to capture everything that is said. Focus on having a clear representation of motions made and the vote count by which they passed or failed. In addition to keeping petitions in a separate file, it is good practice to replicate the basic petitioner information in the minutes. It is also a good practice to keep the names of attendees at each meeting in the minutes. If conferring a degree, keep a copy of the cast members and the candidate(s).
8. **Grand Sessions** – Before the April meeting, remind the Dais officers they are responsible to attend, and arrange a stipend if your Chapter, Council or Commandery can afford it. Remind members who expect to attend to be sure to take their dues cards. If Dais Officers of the Chapter and Council cannot attend, they may issue a proxy, or they may elect a representative. This is true also for Commanderies, whose members cannot issue proxies. The appropriate forms can be obtained on the Grand York Rite website: Scroll to "Elected Representative and Proxy Credentials."
9. **Order of High Priesthood** – Be sure the current HP and PHPs know they are eligible to receive this Order. In fact, it is a Constitutional requirement! Share the petition with them and send to the Grand Secretary. This requirement does not appear to be true for the Thrice Illustrious Master Degree or the Past Commander's Association. Petitions for all three bodies are available at the secure website.




